
Deep Dive: Instant Messaging for the Project

- Our community uses various communication platforms today
 - Mailing lists, forums, IRC, Slack, Discord, Threema, Telegram, keybase, ...
- Instant messaging in particular is fragmented across many channels
- Many of our communication platforms have divergent audiences
 - Developers vs users, Young vs old
- Some "official" channels are obtuse
 - What does #sparc64 have to do with FreeBSD?

IM Goals

- Reduce fragmentation
- Steer users and developers into shared channels to ease collaboration
- Secure platform for non-public conversations

Our Proposal: matrix.freebsd.org

- Open Source
- Existing, maintained bridges available to other networks
- Offers end-to-end encryption
- Variety of clients including webapp, desktop, and mobile
- Server implementations available which run on FreeBSD
 - Allows us to ensure data for private channels is stored on cluster machines
- Popular among other Open Source communities such as KDE and Gnome

How Would it Work?

- Would offer *@FreeBSD.org matrix accounts to all developers
- Would include both private rooms (invite-only) and public rooms (open to anyone) in a FreeBSD workspace
 - Users can connect via any other existing Matrix node such as matrix.org
- Might offer element.freebsd.org web application for developers

What Clients are Available?

- Element web application (works on FreeBSD)
- Cinny web application (works on FreeBSD)
- neochat, KDE client (works on FreeBSD)
- weechat, console (works on FreeBSD)
- Thunderbird (works on FreeBSD)
- Element applications (macOS, iOS, Windows, Linux, and Android)
 - WIP port to FreeBSD

Current Status

- matrix-dev.freebsd.org exists as a test server
- Used internally by core.12 for testing clients, etc.
- No public rooms available currently
- Still working on a timeline for next steps

What about Other IM Platforms?

- Nothing is changing on other platforms right now
- We realize individuals volunteer their time today as moderators on various platforms and are grateful for that service
- Various bridges are available between Matrix and other networks
 - Caveat: We do not anticipate hosting bridges in the cluster
- While we think this proposal will lead to a better IM platform, it ultimately depends on what developers and users choose to use
